By doing this course you will:

- Increase your knowledge and understanding of what cultural safety means and how it's applied in health care.
- Appropriately interpret the application of standards that are related to cultural safety.
- Develop the knowledge and tools to confidently accredit and monitor health education programs.

01 — PRE - EVALUATION

02 — SELF-DIRECTED LEARNING

Six online modules to build your knowledge about cultural safety and learn the skills to be an effective accreditation contributor within a culturally safe environment.



03 — MODERATED DISCUSSION

A full-day facilitated discussion with other accreditation contributors across the health professions to share ideas and discuss learnings from the self-directed training and activities.
